The 2023 edition of the Conference will engage many different stakeholders, who have an interest in seeing a renewed, stronger EU citizenship to understand more about who the mobile EU citizens are, and what lies behind their wish to establish their home in another Member State than the one they were born in.

We will examine together the current legal framework to assess whether it fully supports all EU citizens in this challenging choice and discuss whether new rights should be added to shape a more inclusive European citizenship.

Our conference will open on a keynote speech from Marc Angel, vice-president of the European Parliament, who will present the work undertaken by the European Parliament's LGBTI Intergroup to tackle the obstacles that still remain nowadays to achieve a full application of freedom of movement that includes all types of families.

To set the scene for an informed discussion, ECAS will present the trends of the Your Europe Advice service to citizens on their EU Rights.

Although moving to another Member State is broadly perceived as a mere economical decision, the real motivations that feed such a life change are often complex, involving elements which are emotional at least as much as rational.

Our first panel will focus on showing the variety of factors that lead to such a decision, in an attempt to deconstruct myth and break stereotypes.

While we are expecting the Communication of the European Commission on the Freedom of Movement Directive to be published in the coming months, our second panel will present the diverse types of mobility that exist, and what discriminatory barriers still persist in today's application of freedom of movement.

Finally, we will look together into the future, exploring solutions to support a European citizenship that leaves no one behind.

Our conference will close on the ECAS' Awards ceremony for the citizens - winners of our 2022 Citizenship Awards - on new rights they would attribute to the European Citizenship.
