How to encourage citizens to take part in CS projects?

Motivate volunteers: create a favorable environment. incentives. nemories

Think of how to sustain the positive effect, impression of their participation in citizen science (sustainability of emotions)

What's in it for them in terms of experience and impact

Be clear on how their insights will be used, why it matters
